I wish that did not require star ratings. This is one of those reviews that is ill served by stars, because in one sense I want to rate this novel with five stars, and in another sense one star. Let me explain. The story is extremely clever and imaginative. The concept, and much of the execution is wonderful. Unfortunately, the editor did a huge disservice to the author by not forcing her to cut, cut, cut. A famous author once advised writers to, after completing their novel, eliminate the first 100 pages, because the real novel begins there. This work is a perfect example of the wisdom of this advice. Several times in the first ten percent or so of the novel I almost gave up in dismay. Virtually nothing happened for page after page after page. It was mostly massive, tedious backstory. We had to learn about the (boring) history of faster-than-light drive. The (boring) history of ethnic wars on Earth. The (boring) history of... er... I forget. It was so incredibly boring I don't remember. All of that pointless introductory material should have been chopped out. Even once the story got going (in a vague sense), it kept stopping dead so the author could fill in the reader on some historical background that had nothing to do with the actual plot. An exciting scene (what precious few there were) would just get going, and I would actually be interested in how it would play out, when suddenly, in the midst of high tension, the author would freeze the plot to relate something that happened to the characters years ago. Frustrating!!! I must emphasize that I blame the editor for this, not the author. Seriously, this would have been a fabulous book at about 1/3 its length. It plodded.
